Many thanks to the Chancel Choir for their hard work and support over the last year. Our church is blessed with dedicated musicians.



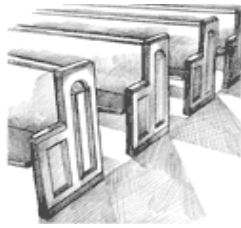

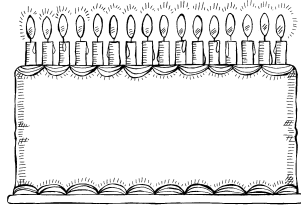

For the price of \$10.00 per person, (tickets can be purchased in the church office, as well as the library, Village Store, Fire Department, Public Works, and Kitchen Cravings) there will be entertainment in our sanctuary and a dinner catered by Kitchen Cravings in our Fellowship Hall.

Gilford's singer/songwriter Don Watson will entertain us with songs that are based on New Hampshire history, people, and places. He co-wrote these songs with poet and historian Steve Redic of Candia; some of the titles are: "Pumpkin Pie" (our state fruit), "Merrimack, Hannah Dustin" and "Welcome Home New Hampshire." Before he sings each song, he will give the historical background. He is in the process of recording the songs and hopes to have a CD available by early summer. Since the release of his first CD "Back East", Don Watson has performed on many stages around New Hampshire including the Franklin Opera House and Meadowbrook, as well as community band stands, farmer's markets, apple orchards and military appreciation events. Once you have listened to him, you will realize why he is now being called "New Hampshire's John Denver" and "Fritz Weatherbee with a Guitar!"

Gilford's Jane Ellis will debut her Gilford Bicentennial song. This was written to highlight what a special town Gilford is, as we celebrate our bicentennial.

Corey Lofblad will also be adding (interspersed with the music) interesting Gilford facts and history.

Following the entertainment, there will be a dinner downstairs in Fellowship Hall catered by Kitchen Cravings. Corn chowder, cornbread and their award-winning chili will be featured. It is hoped that those who enjoy making desserts, will bring some to share!

He told him to come on in, he was hired!

In 2006, Rick and Kandi Edson and their three children, Richie, Olivia, and Shaun, joined Gilford Community Church. The church is very important in their lives and they have been extremely helpful in the everyday business of GCC. Rick is assistant treasurer, a member of the facilities committee and he volunteers to help Scott at the Youth Center. Kandi is on the finance committee. They joined us because they found our congregation to be very friendly, and the ongoing activities and programs interesting. They do miss the balcony in the old church, saying that it was a “gathering spot” on Sunday mornings for parents with young children.

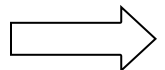
Kandi grew up in Groveland, Massachusetts with two sisters and a brother. She enjoyed the small town life around her and would often run next door to buy fresh milk from the local dairy farm. She was in the school chorus, played basketball, delivered newspapers, babysat every day after school, and was a very good student looking forward to college. Since junior high, she has wanted to be an accountant. In 6th grade, she met a girl in her class named Maria (due to having her seat changed because of her talking during class) and they have been best friends ever since. Kandi visited Maria that first summer after 6th grade at Camp Kabeyun in East Alton, as Maria’s dad was executive director of the camp. From then on, their summers were spent on the lake (the beginning of the ‘bug’ for the Big Lake) working in the kitchen at Camp Kabeyun. Kandi graduated from UMass - Amherst with a degree in accounting while working full time during the four years. Great achievement!! After graduation, she went on to become a Certified Public Accountant, working in and around Boston until moving to Gilford.

Rick grew up in Reading Massachusetts, the sixth of nine children. His father worked for the B & M Railroad and his mom was always there when they returned home from school, supplying them with cookies and other home baked treats. They had a great neighborhood and his parents still live in the same home. Growing up, Rick loved to play sports, but decided to “make money,” instead, and gave up sports during his senior year of high school. He attended Salem State, Framingham State, and UMass Lowell where he received a degree in criminal justice. He did

an internship in Boston at the State House as a senate aide to Republican State Senator Robert Buell. The position involved attending all meetings, dealing with constituent concerns, role-playing in mock senate sessions and meeting interesting politicians including Governor Ed King and Senate President William Bulger. He also attended Computer Processing Institute earning a certificate in computer programming. To help pay his way through college, he took a course at Boston Bartending which prepared him for a career as a bartender. One day, he went to Ken’s Steak House in Framingham to apply for a position as bartender. In the parking lot, he met up with a man who asked him what he was doing and they had a conversation about politics and other subjects. After 15 minutes, the man introduced himself as “Ken Hannah” and told him to come on in, he was hired!! Ken later started the salad dressing company many have come to know and enjoy, “Ken’s Steak House Salad Dressings”.

In 1985, Rick held three jobs simultaneously: North Andover Police officer, program analyst for Blue Cross, Blue Shield and a bartender/asst. manager with 99 Restaurant. In 1987 Rick took a full-time position with the North Andover Police Department. In 1993, he transferred to the Andover Police Department and in 1999, he was awarded Officer of the Year for the arrest of an attempted murder suspect who had just shot her boyfriend. He also received the Life Saving Award for rescuing a man from a burning car. Within seconds of pulling the unconscious victim from the vehicle, the car was fully engulfed in flames. As it turned out, the victim was the brother of one of Rick’s fellow officers. In 1999, Rick was promoted to the rank of sergeant. During that time, he served on the regional SWAT team and counter-sniper and building entry team. He also served as the training officer, firearms instructor and accreditation manager. Rick retired from the Andover Police Department in 2010 after a 25 year career.

Kandi and Rick met at Cedardale Athletic Club in Haverhill in 1991. Kandi was happy to find that Rick was introduced to the lake by one of his good friends in 1988. Their 2nd date was a trip to the lake, a ride on Rick’s boat, and a visit to Kandi’s friends working at Camp Kabeyun. They were married in

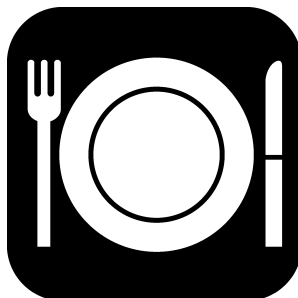
1993 and continued to spend as much time as possible on the lake. Some of their fondest memories on the lake were from 1994 through 1999, when they spent summers aboard the "Plivia Jean", a Searay 268 Sundancer, on J-Dock at the Mountain View Yacht Club in Gilford. Their home was in Andover, MA, but they loved being on the lake. A few years later, they bought a condo as a 2nd home at Gilford Meadows. Seven years ago, Kandi and the kids moved to Gilford and they bought a home in Gilford that was built by Andy Howe (owner of Beans & Greens). The home is a beautiful replica of a 100 year-old saltbox home.

Rick commuted from Andover to Gilford on his days off from the police department and for a while, Kandi continued to work in Boston. In 2005, Kandi joined Stinson & Associates, located in Laconia, and was made a partner in 2008. Kandi travels between the 3 branches in Laconia, Concord and Portsmouth. She is also the owner of the payroll company, Paychecks of New Hampshire, in Laconia. She continues to love her girlhood ambition of being a CPA. Besides her work, she is a mentor with SCORE, on the steering committee of Lakes Region Young Professionals, and she is treasurer of Gilford Educational Endowment Fund. Following his retirement from law enforcement, Rick has become a real estate agent with Coldwell Banker Residential Brokerage of Laconia.

Both Kandi and Rick enjoy gardening, cooking, hiking and spending time enjoying the Lakes Region with their three active children. In April, they traveled to Nicaragua to visit Kandi's parents, who have a vacation home there. The last few weekends have been spent in Maine watching Richie play AAU basketball. Recently, they purchased a cottage on Cow Island as an investment and have started to renovate the property.

It is always nice to find a very busy young couple who are willing to help in the community and in the church. We are lucky that Lake Winnepesaukee was such a magnet for the Edsons many years ago.
